#### Call to Order

Dr. Azzolino called the meeting to order at 9:16 a.m.

#### **Chair's Report**

Dr. Azzolino welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the first Board meeting of 2016. He provided an overview on the Board's 2015 accomplishments and highlighted some of the significant projects that the Board completed in the past year. Dr. Azzolino reported that the Board has made significant strides towards ensuring compliance with the existing Continuing Education (CE) requirements and improving the quality of CE courses available to our licensees.

In addition, Dr. Azzolino encouraged licensees to serve as Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) at one or more of the Occupational Analysis workshops that will be conducted later this year. He spoke about the board's outreach efforts with stakeholders and highlighted publications regarding the board and the chiropractic profession, geared towards licensees and the public. Dr. Azzolino also commented the Board has streamlined the Legislative Review process and Board administrative procedures.

### **Executive Officer's Report**

Mr. Puleo gave the Executive Officer Report. The topics covered were Administration, Budget, Licensing and Enforcement.

Mr. Puleo reported that the Board has two vacant positions in the Compliance Unit, Staff Services Manager I, for which we are actively recruiting and Staff Services Analyst.

Mr. Puleo provided an update on the repayment of the loan for the Arbuckle judgment to Bureau of Automotive Repair (BAR) and the overall budget projections for fiscal years 2014-2017. Lastly, He reported that the budget remains stable.

Mr. Puleo summarized the Board's licensing statistics and stated there have not been any significant changes since the last meeting. He also reported on the Enforcement statistics and provided a brief overview of enforcement activity since the last Board Meeting.

# BCE Licensing, Continuing Education and Public Relations Committee Meeting Update

Dr. Dehn reported on the Committee's progress reviewing the Continuing Education regulations. She provided an update on the CE Provider qualifications focus groups and announced that the next scheduled Licensing, Continuing Education and Public Relations Committee meeting is on February 12, 2016. Dr. Dehn added that the committee has been working on a guide geared towards licensees.

Dr. Azzolino requested that the committee include information for international applicants who want become a chiropractor in the State of California.

Lastly, Dr. Dehn reported that the committee is working on social media to engage stakeholders as well as other Boards and Bureaus

### **BCE Government Affairs Committee Meeting Update**

Dr. Elginer reported that the committee had their annual legislative meet and greets with consultants from Senate Business and Profession, Assembly Business and Profession, Assembly Republican Caucus, California Chiropractic Association, Business, Consumer Services, and Housing Agency, Assembly Republican Caucus and the Deputy and Assistant Director of Legislative and Policy Review, DCA. Dr. Elginer commended the efforts of Mr. Puleo, Ms. Van Allen and Mr. McCarther for organizing the meetings. Dr. Elginer commented that the committee met with SOLID and provided an overview of the Strategic Plan process .The process will start in May 2016. She also encouraged CCA to take a leadership role to encourage participation of their stakeholders to engage in the upcoming focus groups. Dr. Elginer noted that all the Board members would be contacted by SOLID to schedule a one-hour meeting with each member. Lastly, she brought the Board Member Administrative Manual and Legislative Bill Tracking Manual forward for discussion.

Discussion: Dr. Dehn requested clarification on making travel arrangement through Concur and if Concur should be added to the Manual. Ms. Shaw clarified that Concur is a contract and the process may change.

### **BCE Enforcement Committee Meeting Update**

Dr. Azzolino reported the committee has been working on the development of a Consumer Complaint Brochure, the proposed regulatory language for Title 16, California Code of Regulations, Sections(s) 308.1 (Notice to Consumer) and amendments to section 371 (i) (Annual License Renewals and Restoration). Dr. Azzolino reported that the committee has also been working on the proposed Disciplinary Guideline language (Notice to Patients), which would require licensees to notify their patients and prospective patients that they are on probation with the Board by posting a copy of the final decision and order in a common area. He commented that the language needed revisions and referred it back to the Enforcement committee. Dr. Azzolino brought the proposed language for Sections 308.1 & 371(i) forward for discussion.

Mr. Puleo presented the proposed language to amend section 371 (i) in Article 7.5, Division 4, of the Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations forward for discussion. The language would allow the Board to issue a citation and fine specifically for failure to comply with mandatory continuing education requirements. He also noted that the Board currently sends warning letters to licensees that do not comply with continuing education requirements. By amending section 371 (i), this would allow the Board to issue a citation for failure to comply with the continuing education requirement on the first offense.

Dr. Dehn commented there was a discussion at the committee level, which the fine would be based on the amount of continuing education hours that the licensee where short. She also requested clarification if the citation would be considered a disciplinary action on the licensees record. Mr. Walker responded that a licensee would not report a citation as disciplinary action. He also commented that the Board should maintain discretion on the amount of the fine to the licensee.

Dr. Azzolino requested that a motion be made to approve the amended regulatory language of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations, section 371(i).

Mr. Walker clarified the proposed regulatory language to amend Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations section 371 (i) as follows. "Failure to comply with the Board's continuing education requirements shall result in a violation of this section which would constitute unprofessional conduct and the licensee shall be cited and fined by the Board".

MOTION: DR. ELGINER MOVED TO APPROVE THE PROPOSED LANGUAGE, TO AMEND SECTIONS 371 (i) (ANNUAL LICENSE RENEWALS AND RESTORATIONS) IN ARTICLE 7.5, DIVISION 4, OF TITLE 16 OF THE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS.
