PROPOSED REGULATORY LANGUAGE Section 100 – Align Fee Amounts with Fixed Fee Schedule in Statute

Amend Sections 310.1, 317.1, 323, 360, 367.5, 367.10, and 370 of Articles 2, 3, 6, 7, and 7.5 of Division 4 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:

§ 310.1. Replacement License.

Any licensee shall be entitled to a replacement license if his their original license is lost, stolen or mangled, or upon written request and legal documentation of name change. Each request for a replacement license must be accompanied by a nonrefundable fee of \$25.00 \$71, and signed written statement as to the circumstances of loss of said license, or the return to the bBoard office of the mangled license.

§ 317.1. Chiropractic Referral Services.

Chiropractic referral services shall conform to the following:

- (1) A referral bureau shall be made up of at least five doctors, each of whom does not have fiduciary relationship one to the other, with one participating office representing no more than 20 percent of the bureau's available practitioners. The bBoard will consider any extenuating circumstances which will prevent a service from complying with these requirements;
- (2) An application shall be filed with the $\frac{1}{2}$ bard office which has been approved by the $\frac{1}{2}$ bard, and properly identifies the service, structure and members;
 - (a) A nonrefundable application fee of \$25.00 \$279 shall be submitted with the referral service application.

- (3) A telephone number shall be for a separate answering service;
- (4) The answering service of the bureau shall refer the caller to the next doctor on the list on a rotating basis. The following are exceptions:
 - (a) A request for a specialist;
 - (b) Geographic considerations;
 - (c) Request for services in a language other than English.
- (5) Records on each referral shall be kept and include the following:
 - (a) Date of referral;
 - (b) Name and address of patient;
 - (c) Name and address of doctor referred to.
- (6) When a 24-hour emergency referral service is offered, a member of the group shall be available.

§ 323. Reciprocity. Interpretation of Section 9 of the Act.

The <u>bB</u>oard makes the following interpretation of Section 9 of the Act which states candidates for licensure are considered to have fulfilled the requirement of reciprocity if they provide the documentation required by the <u>bB</u>oard showing the following:

- (a) Graduation from a $b\underline{B}$ oard approved chiropractic college, and completion of the minimum number of hours and subjects as were required by California law at the time the applicant's license was issued.
- (b) Equivalent successful examination in each of the subjects examined in California in the same year as the applicant was issued a license in the state from which he is they are applying.
- (c) They must hold a valid and up-to-date license from the state from which they are reciprocating.
- (d) The state from which they are licensed will reciprocate with California.

- (e) The <u>bB</u>oard reserves the right to require any additional education or examination for reciprocity.
- (f) A nonrefundable application fee of \$25.00 \$283.
- (g) A fee, as set forth in Section 5 of the Act, if licensure is granted.
- (h) Five (5) years of chiropractic practice.

§ 360. Continuing Education Fees.

The following represents fees for continuing education:

- (a) Continuing Education Provider Application Fee: \$75 \$291
- (b) Biennial Continuing Education Provider Renewal Fee: \$50 \$118
- (c) Continuing Education Course Application Fee: \$50 per course. A course is defined in Section 363. \$116 per hour of instruction.

§ 367.5. Application, Review of Refusal to Approve.

(a) An applicant corporation shall file with the <u>bBoard</u> an application for Certificate of Registration on a form furnished by the <u>bBoard</u>, which shall be signed and verified by an officer of the corporation who is a licensed person and be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee in the amount of <u>one hundred dollars</u> (\$100) \$171.

- (b) The $b\underline{B}$ oard, within a reasonable time after an application for registration is submitted to it, shall either approve the application and issue a Certificate of Registration or refuse to approve the application and notify the applicant corporation of the reasons therefor.
- (c) The <u>bB</u>oard may delegate to its executive secretary, or other official or employee of the <u>bB</u>oard, its authority under Section 1051, Business and Professions Code, to review and approve applications for registration and to issue Certificates of Registration.
- (d) Any applicant corporation whose application has been disapproved by the <u>bB</u>oard may request a hearing pursuant to Government Code Section 11504. The hearing shall be conducted pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act (Government Code Sections 11502-11528).
- (e) No applicant corporation shall hold itself out or engage in nor shall it render any professional services unless and until a Certificate of Registration has been issued.

§ 367.10. Certificate of Registration; Continuing Validity; Reports.

- (a) A Certificate of Registration shall continue in effect until it is suspended or revoked. Such certificate may be suspended or revoked for any of the grounds permitted by law.
- (b) Each chiropractic corporation shall file a special report, on a form provided by the Board, within 30 days of any change of the officers, directors, shareholders, employees rendering professional services, and articles of incorporation.
- (c) Each special report filed hereunder shall be accompanied by a filing fee of five dollars (\$5) \$98.

§ 370. License Renewal Fees.

The following represents fees for license renewals:

- (a) Annual license renewal for active and inactive licenses: \$250 \$336
- (b) License restoration for forfeited and cancelled licenses: double the annual renewal fee
- (c) Inactive to active status license renewal: same as the annual license renewal fee
